



## Weekly Whimsy Week 17

### Block 48

#### Cutting:

<i>Fabric</i>	<i>Measurements</i>
Color 2	1 @ 4 ¾ x 4 ¾
Color 6	1 @ 3 ⅞ x 3 ⅞
Color 7	4 @ 2 x 2
Color 8	1 @ 4 ¾ x 4 ¾ 2 @ 2 ⅜ x 2 ⅜

#### Techniques:

Pieced Corners

Magic 8

#### Block Breakdown:

The large Color 6 triangle divides this block into quadrants, not rows. There are just two units in this block. The pieced corner unit and the HST 4-patch. That being said, if you dislike pieced corners, you could make that quadrant out of 3 HSTs and a 2" square, which could then change the whole block into rows. For our purposes we will go with the pieced corners.

#### Sewing:

You have made a version of this block before. It is a fun block to play with color placement and small changes to give it a different look. Please forgive me as I played with this one many times. Obviously it is one of my favorites!

In this case, I used the Magic 8 for my HSTs. There are only six needed so you could easily make them with the 2 at a time method. (I have an idea bouncing around in the back of my mind for the "extras" so I don't mind having them.)

Using the method of your choice, make your HSTs, pressing towards color 2. If you are following me on the video, I worked on the pieced corners at the same time so that I could chain piece. Again, you know how you enjoy sewing, so do it your way.

The ultimate goal is to have two 4-patch quadrants pressed towards color 7 with a spun seam in the center and two pieced corner units pressed towards color 8 with the seams pressed towards large triangle Color 6.

Build your block and spin the center seam!
