### Block 19

#### Cutting:

| Color 3       | 1 @ 2 <sup>5</sup> / <sub>8</sub> x 2 <sup>5</sup> / <sub>8</sub>  |
| Color 6       | 2 @ 2 <sup>3</sup> / <sub>8</sub> x 2 <sup>3</sup> / <sub>8</sub>  |
| Color 8       | 2 @ 2 <sup>3</sup> / <sub>8</sub> x 2 <sup>3</sup> / <sub>8</sub><br>1 @ 4 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>4</sub> x 4 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>4</sub> |

#### Techniques:

HST  
Flying Geese  
Square in a Square

#### Block Breakdown:

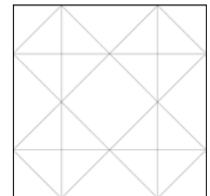
Another Ohio Star! Always my favorite. For this one we are going to need a Square in a Square for the center and HST for the corners. Again, not many decisions to make other than how you are going to make your geese and HST.

#### Sewing:

I always begin with the geese when making Ohio Stars. As you know, I enjoy the Four at a Time Method, but use your favorite. Make four identical geese with Color 8 has the goose and color 2 as the sky piece.

Next, make the Square in a Square for the center. Use Color 3 for the center and cut 2 of Color 2 squares 2 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub> x 2 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub> in half diagonally for the triangles. Press towards color 1. Trim to 3 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>”

Make HST from Color 6 and Color 8 squares 2 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub> x 2 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub>. Press towards color 6. Trim to 2”.



Sew into rows to web the block together.

Press to the “path of least resistance”.

It doesn't matter which way it goes in the long run, and there are so many points, so make it work for you.
