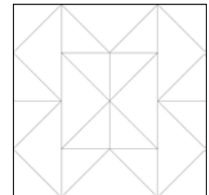

Techniques:

Stitch n Flip
Flying Geese

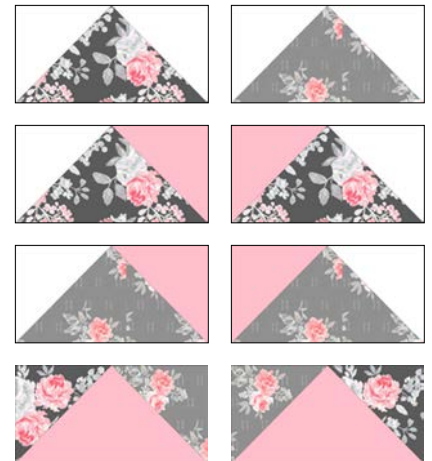
Block Breakdown:

As with so many of these blocks, this one could be built with 16 HST. However, that is a whole bunch of seams and I try to avoid as many seams as possible. So I found a way to build this one with 8 Flying Geese. True that they are all different, but what a fun challenge! Here we go.

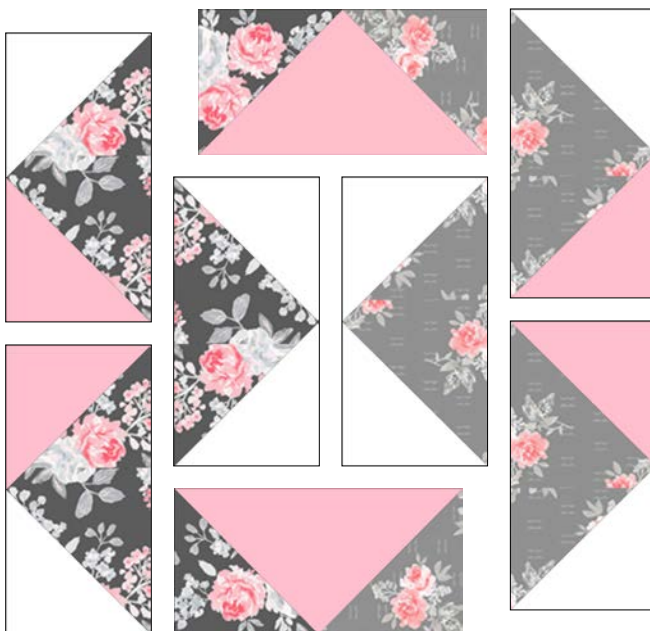


Sewing:

Lay out all of the geese before you begin to sew. You will need to use the Stitch n Flip method. I chose to do the right sides of all of them first, then I went back and did the left. Press all your seams to the sky units.



Once all eight geese are done it is just a matter of puzzling it together.



Pressing is a bit tricky on this one. Lots of very thick spots. I pressed most of those seam open to distribute the bulk. Or, you can press to the path of least resistance, just make sure that everything lays as flat as possible.
