Block 23

Cutting:

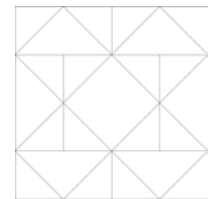
<i>Fabric</i>	<i>Measurements</i>
Color 2	1 @ 4 ¼ x 4 ¼ 4 @ 2 x 2
Color 7	1 @ 2 ⅝ x 2 ⅝
Color 8	2 @ 2 x 3 ½ 4 @ 2 ⅜ x 2 ⅜
Color 11	2 @ 2 ⅜ x 2 ⅜ cut diagonally

Techniques:

Flying Geese
Square in a Square

Block Breakdown:

There are a couple of ways to approach this block. I think that the simplest is making Six Flying Geese and a Square in a Square, however it could also be made by making 12 HST of Color 2/Color 8 and 4 HST of Color 7/Color 11, then building quadrants. This would work just fine but you would have seams in the center block. I try to avoid that when possible as I think it gives a much nicer look. Either way is just fine. I went with the Geese!

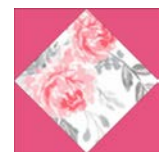


Sewing:

Make the first four geese using the 4 at a time method.

Use Color 2 - 4 ¼ x 4 ¼ and Color 8 - 2 ⅜ x 2 ⅜. This will put Color 2 as the goose and Color 8 as the sky units.

The other 2 geese were made with the Stitch and Flip method. For these you will use Color 2 - 2 x 2 and Color 8 - 2 x 3 ½. These will have Color 8 and the goose and Color 2 as the sky. As always, press towards the Sky units.



Now for the Square in a Square. Press towards Color 11.



Time to build your block. You will notice that you have 2 units in the top and bottom rows and 3 in the center row. This makes it a bit difficult to web it together. Sew into rows and then join the rows.

The pressing is a bit different on this block. In the center row, where the points of the geese and the points of the Square in a Square come together, it is quite bulky. Press the seams open for better distribution of bulk.
